This movie was screened last fall as part of <u>ImageOut Festival</u>, and we at the Cinema Theater are proud to collaborate with ImageOut to promote this current virtual screening. A passionate tale of love and liberation set amidst the ultraconservative confines of modern Georgian society, *And Then We Danced* follows Merab, a devoted dancer who has been training for years with his partner Mary for a spot in the National Georgian Ensemble. The arrival of another male dancer, Irakli--gifted with perfect form and equipped with a rebellious streak--throws Merab off balance, sparking both an intense rivalry and romantic desire that may cause him to risk his future in dance as well as his relationships with

The program is a wonderful outreach for building community, enhancing property values, promoting safe neighborhoods, and encouraging healthy living. Residents build a sense of ownership and pride in their homes and their community relationships grow stronger through gardening.

Sixteen blocks in NW, NE and SW Rochester with a total of 130 households are participating. Twenty-nine Master Gardener volunteers are participating in the project with two Master Gardener volunteers mentoring each block. The program has generously received plant, compost, and mulch donations from Lowes, City of Rochester, garden clubs, including the Rochester Garden Club, and the 1st Unitarian Church plant sale.

Since 2015 Blocks in Bloom has served an average of 15 blocks per year. In the last 4 years, 71 blocks and 665 households have been positively impacted by this program. To see map of Rochester with garden block locations since 2014, <u>click here</u>.



The basic steps are simple:

- Identify city blocks where at least 6 households want to start a front yard flower garden
- Match it with a pair of Master Gardener "mentors"
- Visit each yard to see where the gardener wants to plant, and assess light and other characteristics (while teaching a few gardening principles)
- Schedule a time for each block to prepare their garden beds
- Gather donated perennial plants
- Hold a work-day where gardeners plant with advice from Master Gardeners
- Master Gardeners visit periodically throughout the growing season to mentor

If you are interested in participating in Blocks in Bloom, contact Cornell Cooperative Extension of Monroe County <u>HERE</u>. New gardens must be located within the City of Rochester, in one of the zip codes/areas designated eligible for the program.
