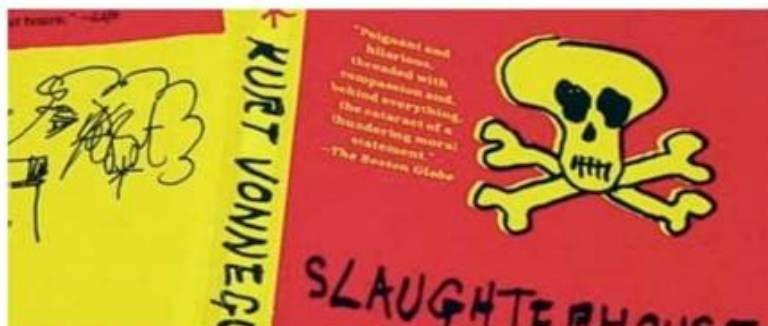

Billy Pilgrim in Vonnegut's novel "Slaughterhouse-Five" was based on a Rochester man who, like Vonnegut, served in WWII, was captured & held as a POW. Unlike Vonnegut, the real-life Edward R. Crone did not survive. Crone's years in Rochester, service in the war, relationship to the novel's character and how it took five years to locate his body for burial in Mount Hope Cemetery will be discussed.
